



Unraveled Designs and Yarn

Tri-Color Beanie

Yarn

Approximately 180-220 yards of worsted weight yarn:

- ◆ 130 (145, 160) yards of the Main Color.
- ◆ 30 (35, 40) yards of the Cuff Contrast Color.
- ◆ 20 yards of Pom Pom Contrast Color.

Gauge

20 sts and 26 rows = 4 inches in stockinette stitch, after blocking.

Needles & Notions

- ◆ US 5 & 7-16" circular needles, or size needed to obtain gauge.
- ◆ US 7 Double Pointed Needles
- ◆ Stitch Marker
- ◆ Yarn Needle

Measurements

Adult Small (Medium, Large): Approximately 20 (21.5, 23) inch finished circumference.

This pattern is the most basic version of a slightly slouchy beanie that you can make! The contrast cuff and pom pom make it a little more interesting, while keeping the knitting super simple. Make the body a little longer for more slouch, or shorter for a tighter fit!

Glossary

k - knit

p - purl

k2tog - knit two stitches together

Section 1: Cuff

With Cuff Color and the smaller needles, cast on 96 (104, 112) stitches, place marker and join for working in the round.

Round 1: *[k1, p1]. Repeat from * around.

Repeat round 1 until the hat measures 2 inches from the cast on edge.

Section 2: Body

Cut Cuff Color, change to larger needles, and join Main Color.

Round 1: Knit all stitches.

Repeat Round 1 until the hat measures approximately 9-10" from the cast on edge. The longer it is, the slouchier it will be!

Section 3: Crown

Round 1: *[k6, k2tog]. Repeat from * around.

Round 2: *[k5, k2tog]. Repeat from * around.

Round 3: *[k4, k2tog]. Repeat from * around.

Round 4: *[k3, k2tog]. Repeat from * around.

Round 5: *[k2, k2tog]. Repeat from * around.

Round 6: *[k1, k2tog]. Repeat from * around.

Round 7: *[k2tog]. Repeat from * around. Cut yarn and pull through stitches.

Finishing

Block gently and weave in all the ends. Make a pom pom if desired and attach to the top of the hat. Enjoy!
